Eco-Club, Rufaida College of Nursing is an active unit organizing various events for raising awareness by observing various environmental days, doing activities such as Nukkad Natak, poster competition, essay writing etc. We have been keenly observing World Ozone Day, World Water Day attending seminars, webinars, up keep of plants and many other activities regularly.

World Wetlands Day is celebrated annually on 2 February, aims to raise global awareness about the vital role of wetlands for people and planet. This day also marks the date of the adoption of the Convention on Wetlands on 2 February 1971, in the Iranian city of Ramsar. India currently has 49 Ramsar sites which are deemed to be of international importance covering 1,083,322 hectares of land. Uttar Pradesh with 10 Ramsar sites is the state with highest number of Ramsar sites in India.

According to WWF-India, wetlands are one of the most threatened of all ecosystems in India. Losses of vegetation, salinization, excessive inundation, water pollution, invasive species, excessive development and road building, have all damaged the country's wetlands.

To observe 'World Wetland Day' and raise awareness among students, a self-composed poetry recitation was organized by Eco-Club, Rufaida College of Nursing at intra school level under the guidance of Ms. Veena Sharma, Principal & Eco Club In charge, Rufaida College of Nursing, Jamia Hamdard. The competition was organized in three languages namely English, Hindi and Urdu.
